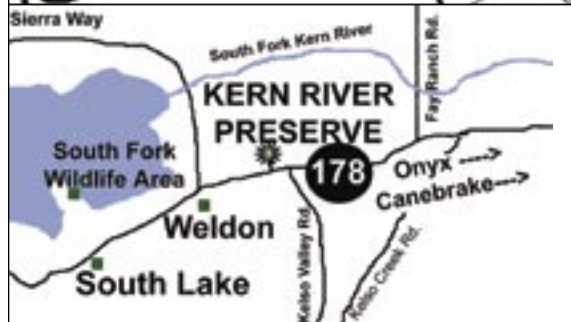

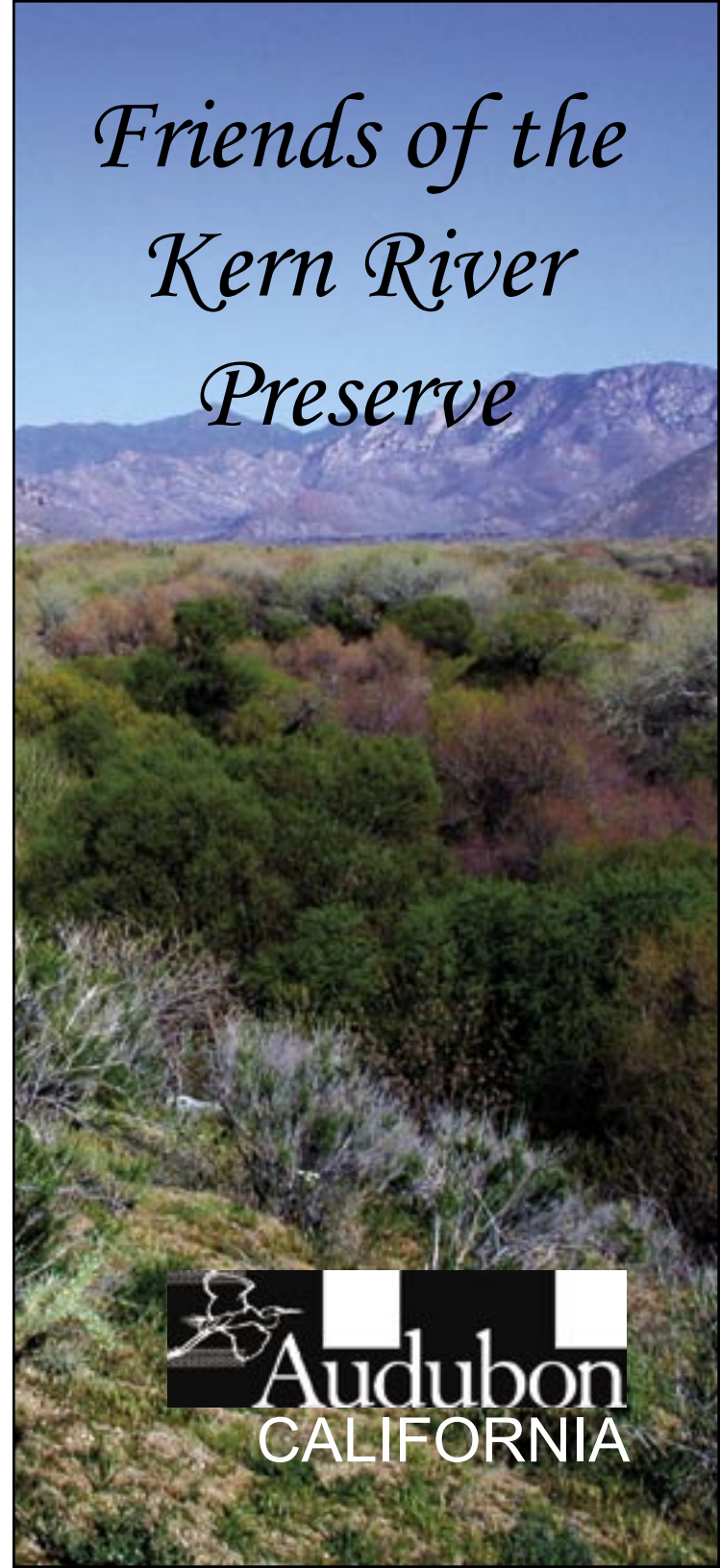

MISSION: *The Friends of the Kern River Preserve is a membership organization that provides financial support for outreach, education, wildlife habitat protection and land stewardship.*

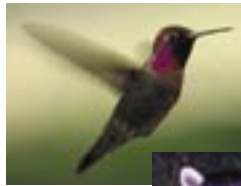

GOALS FOR RESOURCES

CULTURAL: Protect KRP's historic Native American resources.



PLANTS: Inventory and scientifically evaluate the relationshipsensitive plants have to other species.



WILDLIFE: Catalogue the diversity of animals within the boundaries of the preserve and South



Fork Valley.

OUTREACH: KRP Friends help coordinate and staff local festivals. KRP Friends docents lead field trips and



school groups on nature walks on the preserve.



Environmental education is a major component of the Friends, informing people of the importance of living in harmony with the environment is a primary goal.

STEWARDSHIP: Preserve staff and volunteers continue to promote regrowth of riparian vegetation by



actively planting natives and by removal of non-native invasive plants. Maintenance of ecological balance is important to the health of the ecosystem.

LAND PROTECTION: Staff and volunteers actively work within the community to protect the South Fork Kern River corridor. Cooperative agreements with land owners and agencies have preserved many acres upstream, but more protection is needed.
